

Fiscal Sponsorship at Foundation for Louisiana

Foundation for Louisiana (FFL) is a social justice philanthropic intermediary founded in 2005 as the Louisiana Disaster Recovery Foundation to invest in the immediate recovery of communities after Hurricane Katrina. While FFL was established in the wake of Hurricane Katrina, our founders recognized the need to address longstanding inequities that shape the life outcomes of Louisianans. FFL's programs grew in response to those needs, and, today, focus on racial, climate, and gender justice, economic opportunity, and support for Louisiana's vibrant arts and culture.

Through fiscal sponsorship, FFL supports local leaders as they develop innovative responses to unmet needs in our communities. Our program provides critical operational infrastructure across social justice issues with a specific focus on Black and Indigenous-led, grassroots organizations and movements.

Cost-sharing: 10% flat rate

Services:

- 1. **Dedicated Accountant** a staff accountant assigned to your fund to monitor transactions, maintain budget versus actuals, and generate budget reports for internal use and for funders.
- 2. **Fund Manager** a dedicated FFL staff member assigned to your fund who, in additional to offering though partnership as you grow, helps navigate funder relations and reporting, contracts, invoicing, and regranting.
- 3. **Accounts Payable –** weekly payments via ACH to vendors and contractors.
- 4. Human Resources professional human resources support if employees are onboarded at FFL.
- 5. **Legal Advice** support on legal questions from FFL's legal consultants.

Models:

- 1. **Model A Comprehensive –** project belongs to sponsor and is implemented by its employees and volunteers.
- 2. **Model C Preapproved Grant Relationship –** project applies to sponsor for one or a series of grants, sponsor funds project from money received from donors.
